

PAULINE FERRAND-PREVOT

Pauline Ferrand-Prévot is a French multi-discipline bicycle racer who competes in road, cyclo-cross and cross-country mountain biking. Ferrand-Prévot currently rides for UCI Women's Team, Rabo-Liv Women Cycling Team. During the 2015 season, aged just 23, Pauline Ferrand-Prévot became the first person ever - in the history of cycling - to simultaneously hold the World road title, World cyclo-cross title and World mountain bike title.

Ferrand-Prévot is a five-time elite world champion and a nine-time elite national champion across the various disciplines in which she competes. She was the youngest competitor in the Women's road race at the 2012 Summer Olympics, in which she finished eighth.
